Turtle Alert

Countless turtles are run over every year and killed on Ontario's roads, including our back lanes. Seven of our eight native turtle species are threatened, and those most often killed are females travelling to nesting areas. The loss of females in particular is devastating to turtle populations.

Don't Turn Turtle

You can save a turtle's life by stopping and helping the turtle across the road. Just remember to move them to the side of the road in which they were headed. If you try to turn them around they'll just climb back onto the road again.

If you spot a smaller turtle please move it out of harm's way. Snapping turtles or larger specimens should be grabbed by the base of the tail and gently pulled backward or rolled onto their backs on a mat or blanket. Obviously the jaws should be avoided. It's a good idea at this time of year to keep an old pair of oven mitts in your vehicle just in case you come upon a bad-tempered snapper. ▶

Message from the President

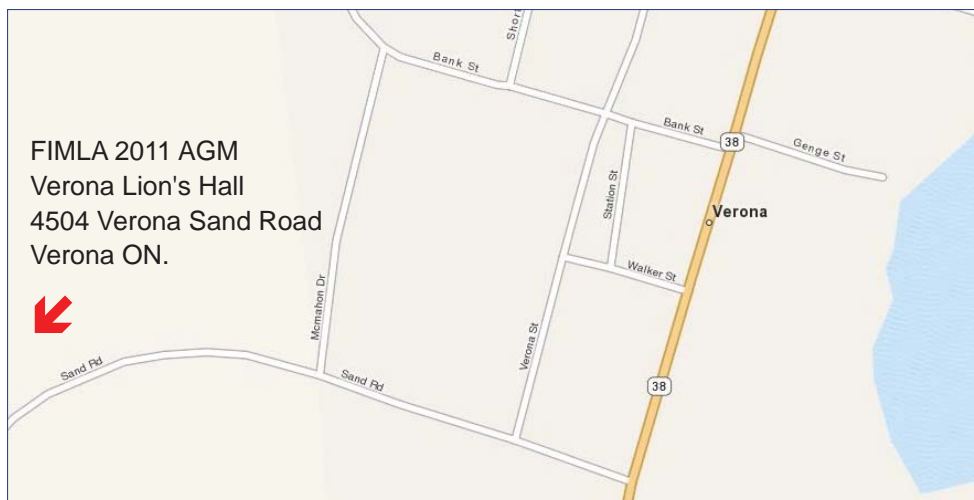
I look forward to welcoming you all once again to the FIMLA AGM at Verona Lion's Hall. Important changes to FIMLA are being proposed at the meeting and I hope you will be able to come along and give your support to these proposals.

Many Lake Associations are finding it is not enough to just have a plan for their lake without taking into account what is happening in the surrounding watershed. That is why in 2007, when we were starting out on the Lake Plan, we extended membership of the Association to shoreline property owners on Little John, Little John's Sister and Buffy lakes, and included these feeder lakes in the Lake Plan. A good partnership and mutually beneficial actions have resulted from this decision. So we are now proposing to make this temporary arrangement permanent and create a new Executive rôle of 'Feeder Lakes Representative' to ensure that the interests of property owners on our sister lakes are fully represented.

We'll also be updating you on the excellent progress we've made so far in implementing the recommendations outlined in the Lake Plan launched last year. Following this, one of our members, Jim Pine, who just happens to be the internet guru of Eastern Ontario, will be our guest speaker. Jim will tell us about how high-speed internet access is coming to Eastern Ontario, to improve the quality of life of residents and to support innovation and economic growth.

Raccoons, skunks and foxes are just some of the predators that devour more than 80% of turtle eggs that are laid. Less than 1% of the turtles that do hatch manage to dodge hungry birds and fish. With so many strikes against them it is extremely rare that any of these creatures make it to their potential life span of 70 or more years.

So, please do your part and keep a lookout when driving, especially during the next few weeks.

FIMLA 2011 Annual General Meeting Resolutions

Change to Bylaws Article II

- a. Notice is hereby given of a resolution to amend the FIMLA bylaws to extend representation of the Association to include property owners on the three feeder lakes flowing into Fourteen Island and Mink Lakes.

ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

Existing text of Article to be replaced with:

The Association is a volunteer association of property owners and concerns itself with taking an active role in maintaining and enhancing the wellbeing of our local environment and the quality of life on Fourteen Island, Mink Lake, Little John, Little John's Sister and Buffy Lakes for both seasonal and permanent residents, as well as representing the interests and welfare of its members to the township of South Frontenac and other authorities.

Change to Bylaws Articles IV and V

- b. Notice is hereby given of a resolution to amend the FIMLA bylaws, subject to agreement to extend representation of the Association to include property owners on the three feeder lakes flowing into Fourteen Island and Mink Lakes, to establish a new executive role of 'Feeder lake Representative'.

ARTICLE IV: OFFICERS

Existing text of first line of Article to be replaced with:

The Executives of the Association shall consist of the immediate Past President, a President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, Lake Steward, Communications Director and Feeder Lakes Representative.

ARTICLE V: RESPONSIBILITIES OF OFFICERS

Add section to end of Article as follows:

The Feeder Lake Representative shall:

- Consult with property owners on Little John, Little John's Sister and Buffy lakes on matters of common concern
- Represent the views and interests of property owners on Little John, Little John's Sister and Buffy lakes in deliberations of the FIMLA Executive
- Liaise with all other executive officers to ensure that Association policies and initiatives are fully implemented on the three feeder lakes where applicable
- Report to the Executive of the Association on specific areas of interest and concern to the three Feeder Lakes and on projects or proposals to address these issues

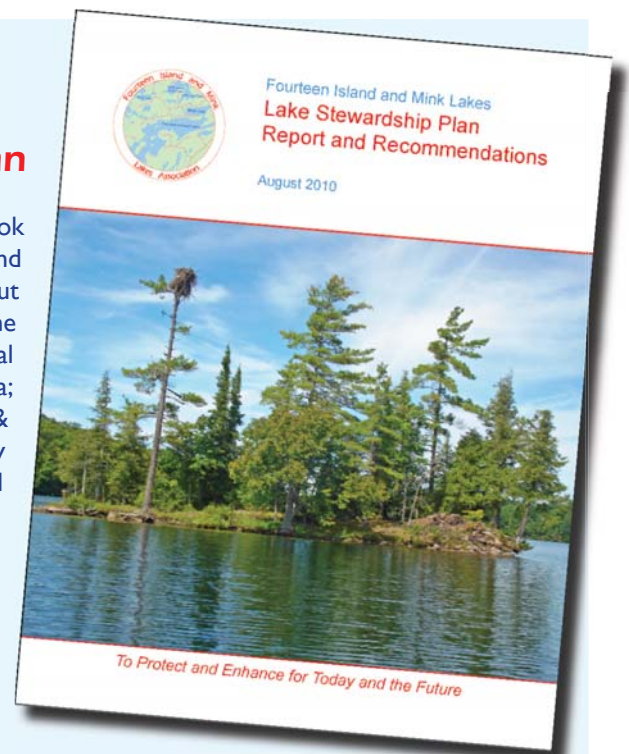
